
"Gangster In Our Midst" — Global!

Guy Houston and his company, The Hideout Inc., bought the property in the **1950s** (Al Capone died in 1947). It was transformed into a seasonal bar and restaurant, known for its prime rib, and offered guided tours focusing on the Capone lore. The Hideout became a top tourist attraction in the area. The property was foreclosed and sold at a sheriff's sale on steps of Sawyer County Courthouse in Hayward, **Oct. 8**, **2009**.
