Two Keefer Sisters from Knoxville

I came across the story of the murder of two elderly Keefer sisters from Knoxville, Iowa when doing research on the Great Depression. ("<u>The</u> <u>Depression Dilemmas of Rural Iowa, 1929 -</u> <u>1933.</u>" Lisa L. Ossian, 2012)

Ossian's book is available online — Ch. 6 contains the Keefer sisters' story. It's an interesting read.


I included their accounting in "GIOM" to convey the level of violence taking place in Iowa by 1932, the year Letitia Keefer, 70, and her younger sister, Jennie, 65, were shot and killed in their farm home.

Three years into the Great Depression people were in distress, fighting over money, land and status—presumably the reason Ossian titled Ch. 6: "Violence: Gangsters, Bandits, Mad Men, and Suicides: Fear, Anger, and Death within a Troubled Landscape."

As the story goes... a neighbor discovered the sisters' deaths (and robbery). Detectives managed to secure several fingerprints and collect four empty .22-caliber shells from the middle of the kitchen floor. Four months later—the murders were solved!

Iowa has had many toutable "firsts" since gaining statehood in 1846. In 1932 it had another, when the state logged the first "CSI" investigation and conviction in the nation based solely on ballistic evidence, proving the bullets from the rifle that killed the sisters belonged to the Keefers' hired hand (who'd also recently come up with the cash to catch up on his Model T payments).

We're looking for a date when I'll be at the **Marion County Historical Society in Knoxville**. My presentation will be what Ossian calls: "**The Lonely Tragedy in Marion County**."
