

Meet "Maggie"

I envisioned a 1926 Ford Model T when I wrote about Walter Bierkoff's "Maggie" in Gangster in our Midst.

I also had a specific farmer in mind when I created the thoughtful, introverted man—Walter... but more about that later.

It wasn't a stretch for me to include in this novel the love affair between man and his car that began soon after the turn of the twentieth century. It's part of American folklore. Though that love affair has not gone on anywhere near as long as the one between man and his booze.

During Prohibition, both became desperate for alcohol.

The Model T was built to be a work horse with high ground clearance for traversing muddy, rutted roads. It could be modified to pull a plow through spring fields, or to add a platform over the rear bumper to allow a farmer to haul his milk to the nearby creamery.

Perhaps what old-timers most remember about the Model T is that the crank in the front was responsible for breaking a lot of arms.

Nonetheless, the Model T became a hero to modern man. Much like its creator, Henry Ford.

Ford's plant in Detroit, Michigan churned out over fifteen million Model Ts on its assembly lines before the car's demise. It was available in every color in the rainbow, as long as it was black.

The Chevrolet ended the run of the Model T in 1927. By then, people wanted style...something more pleasing. Not just utility. Then came the Plymouth with its V-6 engine. Henry Ford countered with the V-8 engine. Gangsters like Clyde Barrow and John Dillinger wrote Henry Ford notes of gratitude for the bigger, faster engine.

Chrysler and General Motors soon organized into unions. The Ford plants followed. But the glory days for the Ford Motor Company, so to speak, seemed to lay in the rear view mirror.

Walter and Henry Ford were similar men. Both hardworking, idealistic, durable. I envision them being of similar height and stature.

But Walter reminds me of another man. A local farmer. One who loved his mother and wife so much that he'd hang ribbons from their funeral sprays at the car's side. And never take them down.
