August NE Iowa Book Tour — Highlights

Attendance was small at my author talk at the Plainfield library on August 6th, but the enthusiasm for the stories behind book two in the Gangster Series, *The*



Black Bag of Dr. Wiltse, Murder on the Prairie, was again extraordinary. The most common comment I receive is about how thoroughly the book was researched.

Iowa was admitted to the Union as the 29th state on Dec. 28, 1846. The northeastern portion of the state was first settled by immigrants from Europe and Canada. A criminal element surfaced as settlers reverted to any means necessary to survive. Land grabs and property thefts became commonplace. Many a corpse was found lying next to a creek, without a clue as to who the murderer was.

Turns out, pioneer physicians knew more about "forensics" in the mid-1800s than one might at first suspect, and authorities frequently sought their help in solving mysterious deaths — such was often the case for Dr. Wiltse.

Banditti gangs also plagued the prairie. Stolen horses, valued at fifty dollars a head, were taken to timbered areas across the border into Wisconsin until they could be sold.

Tracy Moore, author of *The Fire She Fights* (2021), wrote this review of *The Black Bag of Dr. Wiltse*: "This book takes readers on a complex trip through history. The story is organized by the numerous medical challenges presented due to war, illness, misjudgment/mistreatment and murder. This book proves: not only was there a Wild West but an equally Wild Mid-West."
