Mother's Day 2024: "The Life of Mrs. Dr. Alexander Wiltse"

I'm looking forward to giving the fascinating historical review of Phebe Wiltse next week. The Dr. Alexander Wiltse family immigrated from Canada to Iowa in the mid-1850s, initially residing with relatives in the Delhi area before settling in Strawberry Point. Phebe ran her household, cared for her brood of children, and life in general while her physician-husband was out tending the needs of many immigrants arriving weekly to the area—Dr. Wiltse was also attracted to murder investigations.

The general public is invited to attend the free, sixty-minute program. Attendees are encouraged to dress in pioneer-era costume and bring a family heirloom or artifact to showcase. Refreshments will follow the presentations.

Walter Bierkoff is a fictional character loosely based on a Fair-

A. bank farmer, Leo Beierschmitt. Though a Fairbank native myself, I only met this sweet, gentle man in 2016 when looking for people to interview who had grown up in the Immaculate Conception Church and school in Fairbank during the 1920-'30s. Leo was born and raised on the farm that his Catholic ancestors purchased in 1868, located a few miles west of town. Eventually, he became the fifth-generation owner of the farm, and a lifelong member of the church.


Leo noted, "The nuns were tough but sweet underneath. You had to behave yourself!" He got a ruler to his hand a few times, probably for talking back. Father John Halpin baptized him; Father Torpey followed Father Halpin, and Leo served as an altar boy for many years, played baseball on the old diamond south of the quarry next to the church (the priest was the coach). **Read more:** <u>BettyBrandtPassick.com/blogs</u>.
